Germans develop new colon cancer test

Giessen, Germany, Aug. 24 (UPI) --Researchers in Germany have discovered a test for colon cancer that is non invasive, reports the British Journal of Cancer.



Scientists at Giessen University Hospital said Analysis: Ralph a chemical from cancer tumors -- called Tumor M2-PK -- leaks into one's bowel and can be tested via feces, the BBC reported.

Currently, a fecal occult blood test is used to detect blood in feces -- a symptom of bowel cancer. However, the fecal occult blood test cannot tell whether the blood is caused by a tumor or something less serious.

"We found a significant difference in the level of Tumor M2-PK between those with a confirmed diagnosis of bowel cancer and those who were disease free," said study leader Dr. Philip Hardt.
